

Walkers and Ramblers in the Province of Yorkshire North & East Ridings

On Sunday 8th May 2005, walkers from as far a field as Hull and Leyburn joined forces on a circular walk from Ravenscar. Departure was a little delayed owing to Sutton Bank being closed and Len Carlisle having first to milk his cows!

During the walk, with the exception of a couple of small showers, the weather was glorious.

The walk commenced in a northerly direction along the Cleveland Way towards Robin Hood's Bay, but upon reaching Stoupe Beck and finding the tide out, continued along the beach until Boggle Hole when a short refreshment stop was made. Using the slipway to access the main road, the walk then progressed to Robin Hood's Bay along the old East Coast railway track which used to run from Scarborough to Whitby. After a further refreshment stop in a local hostelry, it was back onto the Cleveland Way south to Boggle Hole, up the slipway once more to the main road and through fields and a wooded glade to the railway track and south to Ravenscar.

Boots off, the intrepid walkers retired to the Raven Hall Hotel for afternoon tea and to start planning their next outing. Watch this website for further details.
